It is so lovely to welcome the children back to school for the summer term. We are welcoming Louise to Deborah's class for the summer term as a student teacher.

# Our Topic

Our topic this half term is A bug's Life. This links well with our science learning for the half term looking at plants. We will be starting our first experiment where the children will explore what conditions help plants to grow their best. We will then spend time outside becoming mini beast detectives, searching for mini beasts in their microhabitats and learning about which conditions they like best. We will then use everything we've learnt and create our own clay mini beasts and mini beast puppets.

The topic in the second half of summer term will be Superheroes. This is a great time for us to think about real world heroes from the past and the from the present as well as reading a range of adventure and fantasy stories. The children will enjoy creating comic strips based on their own superhero as well as acting out scenes from various stories such as Traction Man.

# Reading At Home.

Please continue to read with your children at home. They have made amazing progress this year and we are really proud of them. Please continue to return books each week so that they can be changed.

When reading at home, continue to encourage your child to read fluently where possible (re-reading familiar books can be useful for this skill) and to try to add expression where characters are speaking.

While reading the text you can also support your child's development of comprehension skills by talking to them about the events in the story, discussing new vocabulary that you come across together and thinking about how characters may be thinking and feeling at different points in the story.
