We had a great **Fun Day.** Thank you to Carl, parent of Stella, for the great pictures.






















what's been happening at WTW ...

Next Year...

When do the children return to school?

Key Stage 1 and 2 children (Years 1-6) return on Monday 5th September, as well as any children in the Nursery now who are staying in the Nursery.

Reception children will all start on Wednesday 7th September.

New starters in the Nursery have been given individual, staggered start dates.

What time will the children start and finish?

We will continue with the start and end of day times that we had this year.

Nursery and Reception	Start Time: 8:45am	End Time 3:20pm
Key Stages 1 and 2 (Yrs 1-6)	Start Time 8:55am	End Time 3:30pm

If Reception children have siblings, they can either enter via the Walnut Tree Walk gate and then walk through the playground past the school building to line up, or parents can walk them around the block to the Fitzalan Street gate.

The school gates will open at 8:45am each morning.

Where should children line up in the morning?

All children in Years 1 to 6 will enter via the Fitzalan Street gate. Year 1 to 6 parents will not come in the playground in the morning as the current arrangement is working very well and allowing the school day to start promptly.

Nursery parents will come through the playground so that the children can be handed to the Nursery staff team.

Reception children will enter via the Walnut Tree Walk gate. For the first week, parents can come into the playground, but from week 2 onwards they should be able to come through the gate and line up with their teachers.

Where do I collect my child from at the end of the day?

All parents can enter the playground at the end of the day to collect their children. Reception parents, please use the Walnut Tree Walk gate. You can then either leave through the same gate or walk around to the other side and leave through the Fitzalan Street gate. We ask that parents in other year groups only use the Fitzalan Street gate.

What happens if my child is late?

It is really important that children arrive to school on time, and the punctuality at Walnut Tree Walk is generally very good. If you are late bringing your child to school, please ring the buzzer at the Fitzalan Street gate and then bring your child to the main office. You will then need to register your child on the electronic sign in system in the office, giving your reasons for being late.

Term Time Holidays

From September, term-time holidays will not be authorised unless there are very exceptional circumstances <u>and</u> there has been full attendance for the rest of the year. The school's attendance rate has been very adversely impacted by the large number of families taking holidays during term time. Any holidays taken, which are not for exceptional reasons and been agreed by school prior to booking, will be notified to the Education Welfare team at Lambeth.

When will we be able to book after school activity clubs?

After school activity clubs will start at the end of September. I will write to you about what is on offer and how to apply at the start of term. They will run in a similar way to how they have done this year.

How do I book Breakfast and After School for the Autumn Term?

Please note that breakfast and after school club booking for next term will go live at **10am on Thursday 1st September**. We are unable to do this any earlier as we need to have the new Reception children registered before we can offer it out to everyone. I will send a reminder out before the 1st.

The activity clubs will not be arranged until we are back in September. If you book the after school club on 1st September but then get given an activity club, we will adjust your bookings accordingly and transfer funds or refund your account where needed.

In order to book a session at either club, you must be in credit on your Scopay account

for the amount you are requesting. For example, if you require breakfast club daily for 6 weeks, you must be in credit on your account by at least £90 to cover the cost (£3 X 30 days). The exception to this is if you pay for these clubs through one of the following childcare voucher schemes we have in place: Kiddiecare, Edenred and the government tax-free childcare. We also have some parents who are in education who get their childcare costs covered by SFE (Student Finance England). In these cases, you will not need to be in credit to book as long as you have notified Sharon that you are using one of these schemes.

You can book either club online up to seven days before the date needed, subject to availability, but we recommend you book in advance. If you need a club at shorter notice than seven days, please call the school office or email <u>shall@wtwschool.co.uk</u> and if there is availability Sharon will book it for you. Once you book, you are committing to paying for that session. I hope you understand that this is necessary as we have to organise staffing in advance and do not want valuable spaces in these clubs wasted.

After School Club (up until 4:30pm): £5 per day

After School Club (up until 5:45pm): £10 per day
