#### NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe.

All KS1 and KS2 children will be taking part in assemblies provided to schools by the NSPCC called 'Speak out. Stay Safe' which I emailed you about separately yesterday. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. These assemblies have been carefully designed to be age appropriate.

#### **School Policies**

A reminder to you that all of the key school policies are available on our website. Some are reviewed annually by the Governing Body and these have been updated on the website today. I would like to particularly draw your attention to our Attendance Policy - some key points from this are explained below.


#### **Attendance Policy**

#### Why do we need an attendance policy?

The reason for having an attendance policy is explained on page 1 of the policy on our website, but is summarised here:

Good attendance very closely correlates with good outcomes. Children who do not attend school regularly fall behind their peers and do not achieve as well as they should, impacting negatively on their life chances. This is evidenced by national, local and our school data.

In the last two years of SATs at Walnut Tree Walk, the graph below shows the performance of children whose attendance was good (above 95%) and those who are persistent absentees (below 90%).



The figures for Lambeth as a whole show a similar pattern.

In addition, children who regularly miss school can experience more difficulties with their confidence and wellbeing, including developing and maintaining friendships.

When attendance falls below 90%, the government considers this as a 'persistent absence'. In these cases, schools have a **duty** to have discussions with parents in order to try and improve the child's attendance and to offer support or take further action, where appropriate.

#### Term Time Holidays

Holidays taken during term time are **strongly discouraged** due to the impact on a child's education and **will not be authorised** under normal circumstances. You should not take a family holiday while the school is open. However, we do understand that some very rare circumstances may require families to leave the country or miss some school. All requests for time out of school must be made to the Headteacher.

### Messages (continued)

#### **New Reception Outdoor Area**

Over the half-term holiday, the current Reception outdoor area is being replaced. This is the final part of the school playground to be upgraded and we are really looking forward to seeing the children use it once the project is completed. The main part of this work should be carried out next week and the first week back after half-term, so it should only be one week of disruption to the children in terms of outdoor access. The sheltered area will be completed a few weeks later but this should be done over only a couple of days.
