Thursday 12th May:	Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)




During SATs week, we will be providing free breakfast for any Year 6 children who would like it. Please ensure your child arrives between 8:15 and 8:30am each day if they would like breakfast. If not, please ensure that they are in school on time every day as the SATs papers will be started promptly each morning.

Literacy and Maths

With the SATs out of the way from mid-May, we will be able to focus on our creative writing. Our class text will be *Holes* by Louis Sachar. It's a great book which we are sure the children will thoroughly enjoy!

In terms of Maths, we will engage in maths investigations which will be fun and will consolidate the children's learning to prepare them for moving up to secondary school. We will also use the time to support children with any specific gaps in mathematical knowledge.





Science

This term, we will be focussing on the human body - more specifically we will be learning about how the body functions, the effects of exercise, as well as looking into drugs, medicines and reproduction.

Projects

This term we will focus on longer-term, project based skills in different subjects. These are designed to enhance their planning, presentation and public-speaking skills before the transition to secondary school.

For example, in DT, the children are starting a project to design and make a steady hand game. This will involve moving a wire hoop around an electrical system and trying to complete it without a sounding!
