#### Our Winter fair is on the 11th December from 3.30pm until 5pm.

For those of you new to our school, our PTFA events allow us to come together as a school community and also raise some funds whilst doing so.

Typically, during the Winter fair, we run stalls and sell refreshments and were even lucky enough to enjoy some fabulous live music last year, thanks to a very generous donation.

The children are treated to a whole range of fun activities including face painting, lucky dips, hook the duck, cookie decorating, glitter tattoos, art and craft activities, book and toy stalls and games.

There are plenty of refreshments catering for a wide range of tastes and the raffle always has some fabulous prizes. Raffle tickets are sold beforehand and the raffle is drawn during the fair.
