Year 3 spent the day learning about the Stone Age - including making jewellery and tools out of clay, and building model shelters.

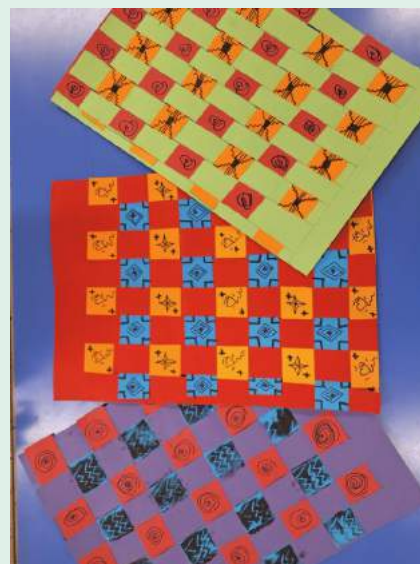


Topic Day (continued)
