Nursery

This term Nursery have had a blast learning about the different people who help us. The children even took a trip outside of school to stop traffic like the lollipop helpers. During Chinese new year, the children learned all about the zodiac animals and made a yummy Chinese stir fry. What's been happening at WTW this half-term...

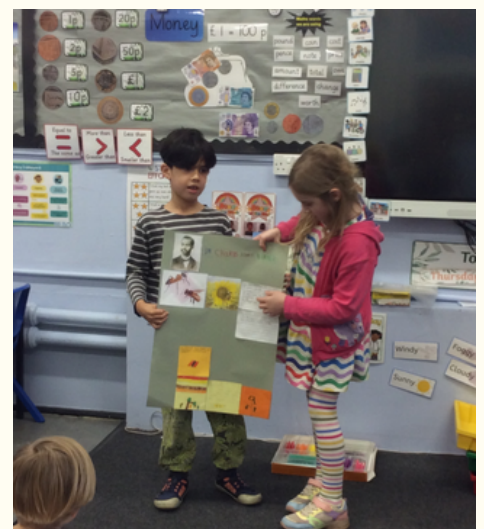
Year 1

This term, Year 1 have had an exciting and busy time! They have been learning all about dinosaurs and even visited the Natural History Museum, where they took part in a workshop to discover how fossils are formed and what they can tell us about the past. They also enjoyed a trip to the Royal Festival Hall to watch Stan and Mabel, a performance by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, and loved joining in with the songs. Back at school, the children have brought in their daffodil plants and have done brilliantly in the competition, with many winning silver and gold awards!



Year 2

During this half term, the children have enjoyed an exciting range of learning experiences. They took part in the KS1 Brightsparks activities alongside Year 1 and shone as the stars of the Lambeth Music Festival. They have also been strengthening their oracy skills by presenting science posters on the scientist Charles Henry Turner and performing a fable in celebration of World Book Day.



What's been happening at WTW this half-term...

Year 3

Year 3 worked together to create a pneumatic monster for their D& T project. They used syringes and tubing to make parts of the monster move, bringing it to life with air pressure. Year 3 made their own groggers and explored how they are used during Purim celebrations. They took part in an interactive, hands-on workshop with the Jewish Museum, where they learned about Passover. The children enjoyed creating, exploring and asking thoughtful questions throughout the session. Year 3 gave a fun performance of their history topic, Through the Ages, which explores the period from the Stone Age to the Roman era.



Year 4

This spring term, Year 4 have had a busy and exciting time across the curriculum. In DT they worked with Sam to make delicious empanadas, developing their cooking skills. The children also enjoyed celebrating World Book Day, where they shared their love of reading by dressing up as their favourite characters and reading stories to the Year 1 pupils. To round off the term, Year 4 went on a fantastic trip to Kew Gardens, where they explored the Amazon rainforest and learned about its unique plants and artefacts.

Year 5

This half term, both Year 5 classes had their Class Assembly week. The children enjoyed learning their lines, creating the stage set, and practising their dance routines. Their final performances were a celebration of their hard work, and they made us all incredibly proud. In Design and Technology, the children thoroughly enjoyed designing and sewing their very own slippers, taking their ideas from initial sketches right through to the finished product. Additionally, the children enjoyed celebrating World Book Day by dressing up as their favourite characters.
